Ten percent of the collection consists of early editions and copies with significant provenances or fine bindings. Highlights include several early editions of Euclid (including Erhard Ratdolt's first edition from 1482) and numerous early astronomies.

The archive of Rabbi Moses Nahum ben Benjamin Yerushalimsky (1855-1914) consists of more than 25,000 archival items, both printed and manuscript: announcements, petitions, invitations, and approbations - a wealth of literary raw material on public issues, Jewish education, Jewish law and customs, and fascinating communal problems. Yerushalimsky was a leading rabbi, author, and communal leader of Polish and Russian Jewry. 6,500 documents and 4,000 postcards from the collection have since been scanned and catalogued.
